On September 20, office employees at the Notre-Dame-des-Neiges Cemetery surpassed a bleak milestone: one year on strike. To mark the occasion, a hundred activists from all walks of life came out to support the strikers and remind them that CSN unions have not forgotten about them.

Comrades, we're with you to the end! We'll support your fight until you get a satisfactory resolution that measures up to what you deserve.



CAFETERIA WORKERS

Cafeteria employees at Cégep du Vieux Montréal and Cégep Montmorency are there, day in, day out, serving all the students and staff at these educational institutions.

Predominatly made up of women, cafeteria staff are hard at work from 6 a.m with dedication and professionalism. They carry out all the tasks required to ensure a smooth running food service, including:

- Receiving deliveries
- Pantry management
- Food preparation
- Meal counter service
- Payment processing at the cash
- Dish washing

Cafeteria workers are extremely invested in their negotiations since the collective agreements for their two unions expired several months ago. Bargaining is unfortunately expected to be quite challenging with private employers (Groupe Compass (Québec) Itée et Laberge - Services Alimentaires inc.) who refuse to adequately recognize their work at its fair value.

PROUD MEMBERS THE MULTISECTOR

With the skyrocketing cost of living and an average current hourly wage sitting around \$16, these women are ready to lead the charge to obtain a better quality of life and decent salary conditions. They only ask for one thing: working conditions that allow them to keep feeding, with dignity, scholarly eaters in the cafeterias at Cégep Montmorency and Cégep du Vieux Montréal, generation after generation.

They are mobilized and determined to fight to the end to reach their union goals. They have the tools, strength and solidarity needed to achieve it, not to mention all that support from 350,000 CSN members!

DID YOU KNOW...


That the vast majority of employees in cegep cafeterias are women and have a starting salary of 16 bucks an hour?

This means these employees have trouble earning the minimum viable income needed to live a life with dignity, as shown in a recent study by the Institut de recherche et d'informations socioéconomiques (IRIS).

Many other studies, including **one by the Institut de la statistique du Québec (ISQ) in 2022**, have shown that the majority of people earning minimum wage or thereabouts, are women, a trend that has persisted for more than 15 years.

To fight poverty and encourage the provincial government to raise the minimum wage, a coalition of union groups, including the CSN, launched the **"\$18 minimum wage"** campaign **https://minimum18.org/** This campaign also calls on employers to raise entry-level wages to address labour shortages.

With an inflation rate hovering around 6% in 2023, it is critical that employers proportionally adjust worker wages in line with the cost of living so these people can finally live a life with dignity.
